

ASK Hive Community Hub

At the open meeting held at Averham church a management committee was formed. This was after voting on the legal format a Community Benefit Society and the 'Model Rules' it will be governed by.



The level of interest and commitment is growing at a good rate, especially considering the time and uncertainty involved in acquiring the Manners Sutton School in Averham as we still await a proposed selling price from Nottinghamshire County Council (due August 2024).

From those attending and apologies received along with their nominations, a management committee of <u>eleven directors</u> were appointed. These directors will be the driving force in acquiring the property and funding to set this wonderful Community Hub opportunity on its way.

Once the company has been established "ASK HIVE LIMITED" will have seven months to hold the official Member Annual Meeting where officers will be formally voted on for a term of three years, although in this Member Annual Meeting, the first third of officers with most votes will serve the full three year term, and the others a two and one year term (as per the Model Rules) so that the whole committee isn't up for re-election together in three years time. The Rules also allow the committee to appoint people from outside for their experience or expertise if this is appropriate.

Details of the minutes will be published here after the next management committee meeting agrees and signs off the previous minutes. Finally we would like you to join us and help in whatever way possible. This may be adding to the great ideas on how the Community Hub candidate be used, it may be that you are willing to express an interest in being either a pioneer shareholder or becoming a member shareholder.




So, we have a new Government, and many new MPs in all the Parties. What a challenging situation they face on many issues. Here I reflect on the centuries-old influence of Christian beliefs and practice on our Parliamentary system and national life, from a very dominant monarch and ruling elite, to today's democratic process, with the Monarch as a stable figure-head as Head of State, and a House of Lords based solely on birth, a distant memory.

The process took centuries. Significant developments would include the Magna Carta (the protection of the Law for all people): the Restoration of the Monarchy in 1660: the Abolition of Slavery: the development of the Labour Movement owing more to Methodism than to Marxism: Universal Suffrage: the development of The Welfare State. A lengthy process, it may be far from perfect, but it has been based on the Christian belief in mutual responsibility for people's welfare ("Love your neighbour as yourself").

We need to hope and pray that this progress will be maintained in our increasingly secularised and multicultural society, with fewer people acknowledging a Christian belief. (I fully appreciate that you don't have to be religious to have high moral standards, but a Christian Faith certainly guides and sustains them.) Interestingly, in this Parliament more MPs than previously chose to make a secular affirmation rather than swear allegiance on the Bible or other Holy Book.

As society becomes more secular in its beliefs, knowledge of Christian teaching and its application declines. Some would maintain that the downplaying of the desirability of a stable marriage and family life as the basis for children's

upbringing is contributing to problems for "fatherless" boys. Our outgoing Prime Minister, a practising Hindu, described Christian communities as part of the national fabric, and praised the Christian values of tolerance, compassion and charity. Here is a prayer, by a former Archbishop of York, which I use regularly and which you may find helpful.

David Bartlett.

"God of eternal love and power, save our Parliamentary Democracy; protect our High Court of Parliament and all its members from partiality and prejudice; that they may walk the path of kindness, justice and mercy.

Give them wisdom, insight and a concern for the common good. Since the weight of their calling is too much to bear in their own strength, send them help from your Holy Place, and be their tower of strength."
